## **School Uniform**

Thank you for making such an effort with the school uniform, the children look very smart. A few parents have asked questions about the new policy, our aim is to make the uniform simple to wear and cheap to buy, especially as children grow so quickly! To clarify, the only piece of uniform that must have the school logo is the jumper or cardigan.

- Nursery children do not need to wear school uniform
- All other children must wear a royal blue sweatshirt/cardigan with the New Park logo (available to buy from Rawcliffes): No other blue sweatshirts or cardigans are allowed
- Plain white shirt or white polo shirt (must have collar). Polo shirts with the school logo are also available from Rawcliffes but are NOT compulsory
- Plain black shoes. No boots, heels, sandals or flip flops. No logos
- No make-up or jewellery (one pair of stud earrings is allowed)
- No overly decorative headbands, bows or clips
- In warm weather, children can wear grey or black shorts, blue gingham dress and white socks

## Free Uniform and trips

Remember, we provide free school uniform, free school trips, swimming and free entry to other events, as well as a free school dinner to children who are eligible.
