Y2 - Column Addition and Subtraction — 2 digit by 2 digit:  Practise the column method with your tens and ones, then have a go at drawing them out and then practising with just the numbers. Why don't you use a dice/number cards to generate your numbers and make some column subtraction and addition questions of your own!  Remember the rules for regrouping and exchanging. Research and play outdoor games which would have been played by children in the 1940s.  Design and test a parachute (using a toy) that would allow a member of the RAF to land safely.
