## New Park Primary Academy - Remote Learning Plan



In order to ensure that learning is continued, irrespective of lockdown and self-isolation, New Park primary has developed the following plan. This plan offers remote learning opportunities whilst also acknowledging that some households have limited access to devices and would require hard-copies of work and resources.

This plan will be applied in the following instances:

- 1. A pupil needs to isolate because someone in their household is symptomatic or tests positive
- 2. A whole bubble is self-isolating because of an outbreak of coronavirus

The plan complies with the expectations and principles outlined in the DFE document Guidance for Full Opening of Schools.

## Software and online platforms

Within all plans, teachers will set appropriate work in-line with our current curriculum, primarily supplemented by a range of resources provided by Oak Academy and White Rose Maths.

Children will be able to contact their class teacher through MS Teams (after taught sessions). Parents will be able to contact teachers via email.

Oak Academy has been selected to support remote learning for a number of reasons. The Oak Academy lessons are in-line with our teaching ethos – they encourage the use of retrieval practice, explicit teaching with high quality modelling, and the use of deliberate practice. The online lessons are free to all and offer a recorded taught session so that the children can access physical teaching from a teacher and then access work relating to that lesson within the same website. There are also hundreds of lessons specifically aimed at children with SEND needs and requiring additional support. Classteachers should demonstrate using the lessons in the classroom so children are familiar with the platform.

White Rose Maths resources will be used as they are matched to our current maths curriculum model. Children are used to seeing these resources.

Spelling Shed and TT Rockstars will all be utilised to support the acquisition and retention of basic core skills.

MS Teams will support school in offering true online learning with the opportunity for the children to communicate with their teacher in real time. Often this will be used so children can 'drop-in' to receive further support after accessing the Oak Academy resources. The 'chat' page will offer the chance for teachers to celebrate children's work and maintain a sense of community and belonging in the event of a whole bubble self-isolating

New phase email addresses are in place for parents can to contact teachers for information and support.

In the event of any form of isolation and loss of learning caused by Coronavirus, parents must understand that engagement in home learning is compulsory, as is the expectation that New Park Primary Academy makes that provision available and accessible to all. However, if children themselves are too ill to attend then they should not be expected to engage in home learning.

In preparation for home-learning, parents and children need to receive logins and passwords for the following platforms (likewise teaching staff need to be familiar with them):

- MS Teams
- Spelling Shed
- TT Rockstars

## Worksheets and Practical Resources

If a child is isolated from school i.e. the child is sent home from school to either receive a test or self-isolate as someone in the household is being tested, they will have a pack of work immediately available for them to complete. They have the option of accessing this via the school website or a physical copy given to them as they leave school. A stationery pack will also be provided. These work packs will be basic skills work that are relevant at any stage of the year i.e. maths, spelling, reading, writing and handwriting.

## **Remote Learning**

The initial response to any isolation will be to provide children with home learning materials alongside a class stationery pack. In the case of whole cohort isolation, resources will be available from the school website and priority children will have packs delivered. This measure will afford teachers a short time to prepare their remote learning resources.

The teacher can also offer alternative resources if the child is struggling (in the first instance the preceding year group's resources will be suggested). The class teacher will record a daily video message on MS Teams for their class explaining the daily lessons and resources that the children are to use. On the first whole day of isolation this video will remind children and parents of the remote learning arrangements and expectations. Teachers will also share a timetable of learning – this will consist of core subject lessons, a non-core lesson and a whole class reading session per day.
