


# Reading Newsletter: December 2020


Year 1/2's favourite book has been a **non-fiction book about the Fire of London**. There were so many facts to find out!

Reception have loved reading **'The Room on the Broom'** by Julia Donaldson and joining in with the fantastic rhymes and the actions.




## Books to read when you are worried:




We love this in Year 3/4. It has lovely photographs and a wide variety of animals and birds that reflect human emotions.




You can get hours of discussion and discovery from this book. All sorts of fears are examined – all with compassion and humour.
