





Dear Parents and Carers,

This term may be short, but it has also been extremely busy with lots of opportunities for the children to deepen their learning across school.

#### **EYFS**

It has been extremely exciting watching nature come to life in EYFS. We had 8 chicks hatching over the course of one day and the children have been exemplary in caring for them since they arrived. They are growing by the minute, so it is fascinating for all of us to see the changes which are occurring. Trips to Corn Close Care Farm are continuing, with Mrs Crowther's class going last week and Mrs Brett's class visiting this coming Friday.

EYFS enjoy welcoming visitors to their classroom and recently had a visit from local postie, Sam Wiliams.

#### KS1 – Years 1 and 2

In KS1 our Year 1 and 2 children are also exploring nature, investigating the impact of the environment on the growth of plants. The children are really enjoying our new music curriculum, learning how to play glockenspiels, exploring different genres of music and learning through singing. #### LKS2 - Years 3 and 4

In LKS2, we all enjoyed going to Harrogate High School to see pupils rehearse for their upcoming variety performance. It was really inspirational for the children in Year 3 and 4 to see older pupils dancing, singing and acting on stage. Watching the hard work which goes into rehearsals has made them even more excited about visiting Harrogate Ladies College on the 13<sup>th</sup> March to see their production of Bugsy Malone, and about putting on their own performance of 'Mini-beast Madness' (linking with their current Science learning) on Thursday 21<sup>st</sup> March. There will be 2 performances for families on that date – 9:30am and 2pm. Details of how to book tickets for these will be sent out nearer the time.

### UKS2 - Years 5 and 6

Year 5 and 6 had a brilliant time at Lime Tree Planetarium – kicking off their Project Based Learning Project. Their increasing knowledge about Space is extremely impressive! The standard of writing in UKS2 is always incredible, and this terms novel study – 'The Viewer' is clearly both inspiring and intriguing many of the Year 5 and 6 pupils with some brilliant writing being produced. They have been working on their persuasive writing this week and are becoming quite skilled at it, so expect some tough negotiations over the coming months!
