Maths	English	Other activities	Other activities
<p><u>Estimating</u> Estimating means to make a clever guess. Take turns to place some toys in a box, estimate how many there is inside by looking. Count to see if you were close. You could play this game again with food on a plate e.g. estimate how many crackers or grapes.</p>	<p>Can you write a shopping list of things that you need? You can use it next time you go to the shops.</p>	<p>Create a cutting station to practise your scissor skills. Your grown up can draw straight, wiggly and zig zag lines for you to carefully cut. You could cut out some shapes too! <b>Physical development.</b></p>	<p>Play a memory game with an adult or a friend. Place items down on the floor. Look away as the other player hides an item. Write down what you think is missing. Did you get it correct? <b>Personal, Social &amp; Emotional</b></p>
<p><u>One more than</u> We have been learning about 'one more than.' Draw a number line to 20 on large paper or chalk it on the floor. Throw an object at the line and see where it lands. Can you shout out one more than the number it has landed on?</p>	<p><u>Red Word hunt.</u> Ask your grown up to write your red words on post its or small pieces of paper and hide them around the house. You need to go on a hunt to find them. Take paper and a pencil with you. When you find a red word read it and write it down 3 times!</p>	<p>Have a tea party with your favourite toys, teddies and dolls. You need to share everything out so that it is fair. You could sing some songs and learn some rhymes at your tea party. <b>Expressive Art &amp; Design</b></p>	<p>Draw or paint an Easter picture. You could draw some colourful eggs, chicks, flowers or even the Easter bunny! <b>Expressive Art &amp; Design</b></p>
<p><u>One more than BINGO</u> Write down 6 numbers on your paper between 1 and 20. Ask a friend or grown up to call out 'Cross off one more than..' e.g. one more than 5 would be 6. Cross it out. Can you cross them all out and shout BINGO!</p>	<p>Draw the alphabet across a few pieces of paper. Test you know what sound each letter makes. Then go on a hunt around the house to find objects that begin with each letter sound.</p>	<p>Write down a numbered list of different actions e.g. do 10 hops, balance on one leg, do 6 leaps etc. Roll two dice, add the number of spots together and complete the action which you roll. <b>Physical Development</b></p>	<p>It is Spring time! During springtime we see some flowers bloom. During a walk have a look for some signs of spring. You could take some photos. When you are home you could carefully draw some daffodils. <b>Understanding the World</b></p>
<p><u>Making Patterns.</u> Show your child how to make a repeating pattern. You could use coloured Lego bricks, finger painting or draw it. Ask them to describe the pattern and ask them what they notice about it. You can then increase difficulty of the pattern e.g. red, blue, green, red, blue, green, red, blue, green OR red, red, yellow, red, red, yellow. Can your child create a more complicated pattern?</p>	<p>Choose a character e.g. a unicorn, spiderman, a cat etc and then choose a setting e.g. the forest, a castle, school etc. Draw the character and setting on some paper. Can you make up a story using your character and a setting?</p>	<p>Use the internet or a book to find out about your favourite animal. Challenge yourself to learn some facts. You could make an information sheet or a book all about your animal. <b>Understanding the World</b></p>	<p>Grab Blankets, cushions and teddies to create your own reading den. Build an awesome den and then snuggle inside with a book to read. <b>Expressive Art &amp; Design</b> <b>Literacy</b></p>
<p><u>Packing list</u> Pretend your child's teddy is going on holiday! They need to pack their bag for them. Your grown up can draw a packing list for your teddy. E.g. 6 socks, 10 books etc.. Can you accurately pack everything that Teddy needs?</p>	<p>Get creative making some Easter cards! Then you need to write a lovely message inside.</p>	<p>Go on a bug hunt outside on in your garden. See what you can find. Can you name the minibeast which you find? <b>Understanding the World</b></p>	<p>Play shops. Collect some tins and packages from the cupboard. Take turns being the shop keeper and customer. You could even make some shopping lists and some paper money. <b>Expressive Art &amp; Design</b></p>
